GUEST SPEAKER RSPB DAVE O'HARA

This is our quiet time of the year, New Year day was our first day opening and due to the mild weather saw in increase in visitors. We are currently hedge planting, during December school children come along to help and in May the children will return to help plant the wild flowers. **219/20**
Last year 105 thousand visitor passed through the centre, the good weather during August, September and October encourage visitors to the cliffs.
We are working with ERYC Nature Tourism officer to encourage off season tourism in the area.
In February we are hosting yoga sessions, keep an eye on the RSPB website for more information.
The councillors raised concerns regarding Cliff Lane traffic, parking in the village and the condition of the trod. Ward Councillor Dealtry offered to speak with ERYC to see if they were willing to work with the RSPB and parish council to improve the trod.
